- Dolly wanted:

good books sent by the Post Office to the home of the newborn to 5 year old participants every month

 She especially wanted this programme to be for all children, regardless of income.

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

#### **Doncaster TALK Book Sharing Messages**

Children need to talk a long time before they learn to read, sharing a book is a great way to help your child

"Book Chatter, Book Play, Where will your book take you today?"

Take time out to explore and talk together about the pictures and the story in your home language

Anyplace, anytime, again and again! (always keep a book in your bag!)

Listen to your child, let them lead and tell you the story!

Keep it fun! Keep on sharing!







# Why we decided to do it!

- To develop a love of stories and reading within our Early Years setting
- To promote early language and extend vocabulary
- To support parents in using books as a tool for enjoyment, sharing quality time, being inspired by stories, rather than seeing books as a 'thing to be done' or a 'race to the finish.'
- Modelling ways to 'look deeper' into a book
- Find out about our parents reading experiences and habits
- Inspire 'book-less' households that the actual reading of a book is fundamentally the least important part of reading!



# What a session looks like...

- 10 min 'book chat' with parents and explanation of the activities
- Give parents a task to think about whilst completing the activities
- Explain which aspect of 'early reading' I am going to model
- Work with the children on the story reading it all, looking at a page and using observation and prediction, relating to real life
- Explain activities to the children (as a prompt to parents)
- Off we go!!

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
# The boring assessment and school stuff...

- We started last year (May 2017) in F1
- More children are predicted to get ELG in Reading than ever before (65%) with 8 children (all who's parents attended IL mornings) predicted exceeding in Reading
- In current F1, 85% of children are on track for ARE in Reading (more than ever before!)
- Reading areas are being used more frequently during children's free choice time in both F1 and F2
- F2 have started Reading Mornings in their classroom too


