Community Programmes







- Funding is for projects of up to 12 months
- Grants £500-£20,000
- Only registered charities for over £2,000
- Similar funding programmes but support different types of projects





Application Process

Two-stage, online application process:

Stage 1: Expression of Interest (EOI)

 Short description of your organisation and "elevator pitch" (500 characters) about your project

Stage 2: Full application

More detailed questions - project description, budget etc



Next Funding Round





Examples of the types of costs supported

- Capital equipment; creation of new outdoor spaces; sensory rooms; equipment; vehicles; clothing; gazebos etc.
- Staffing demonstrate sustainability beyond 1st year
- **Training** e.g. employability (preferably with qualifications), volunteer training etc.
- Volunteer expenses
- Running costs associated with the project venue hire, travel for staff, insurance, utilities etc.
- Marketing costs Posters, leaflets, web hosting etc.



Exclusions

- Research, palliative care & medical equipment
- Statutory bodies (inc. local authorities), individuals or commercial business
- Schools, PTAs, colleges & universities
- Overseas projects
- Groups with exclusive membership
- Promotion of religion
- Trips and on off events
- General sponsorship



Getting ready to apply for funding

- Package your work into projects
- Research some funders
- Constitution
 - Dissolution clause
- Annual Accounts
 - Clearly show income and expenditure
 - Explain reserves
 - Bank account in name of the group



Tips and Hints

- Read the funding guide
 - Is your organisation eligible?
 - Is your project eligible?
 - Are you applying to the right Trust?
- Explain what you want to do as well as the difference you want to make
- Some aspect of the project should last beyond the funding e.g. capital, qualifications, volunteer maintenance, income generation etc.
- Clearly break down your costs
- Ask for help! Call or email if in doubt or speak to a local support organisation



Things to avoid

- Sticking applications in without reading the guidelines
- Just applying to one funder even amazing projects will not get funded







- Unrestricted funding up to £500 for sports & physical wellbeing activities
- Annual income under £50,000.
- Priority given to under £20,000
- Short application process
- Outcome within 4-8 weeks
- Localgiving membership included for successful
- Access to all of Localgiving's other services
