UK Statistics

- Almost 60% of children from low-income families are delayed in language by the time they start school (Locke, Ginsborg & Peers, 2002)
- Low-income children are on average 16 months behind their high-income counterparts in vocabulary development at age 5 (Waldfogel & Washbrook, 2010)
- Vocabulary at age 5 is the best predictor of whether disadvantaged children are able to 'buck the trend' and escape poverty in later adult life (Blanden, 2006).

- Promotes dialogic interaction
